March's Fulfillment Hour Lessons Unit 1: Follow in My Ways

This quarter focuses on ways God's people have acknowledged the greatness of their God. We begin with guidance for following Him. The quarter concludes with a look at times when the Hebrew people sang praises to God.

March 4th – The Lord will provide (*Genesis 22:1-3, 6-14*)

⇒ Golden Text - Genesis 22:8 (AMP) – “Abraham said, my son, God Himself will provide a lamb for the burnt offering. So the two went on together.”

What is it that stirs us to sacrifice our lives to God, to make an absolute surrender to Him? Trust, believing that God has the power to raise us up and use us. And God does: He does have the power to take our lives, raise them up, and use them for good throughout the whole world. We must, therefore, trust God and sacrifice our lives in absolute surrender to Him—for the sake of the world, the needy and loss of the world.

March 11th – There is No God like You (*2 Chronicles 6:12-21*)

⇒ Golden Text - 2 Chronicles 6:14 (MSG) “And prayed: GOD, O God of Israel, there is no God like you in the skies above or on the earth below, who unswervingly keeps covenant with his servants and unfailingly loves them while they sincerely live in obedience to your way.

It is God alone who keeps His covenant (promises) and shows unfailing love to those who obey him (v.14). God is faithful. When He makes a promise, He keeps it. But note: His promises are conditional, given only to those who wholeheartedly obey Him. God's faithfulness never changes. If a person is obedient, God's unfailing love will pour out the richest blessings upon the believe.

March 18th – The people gave thanks to God (*2 Chronicles 7:1-9*)

⇒ Golden Text – 2 Chronicles 7:3 (MSG) “When all Israel saw the fire fall from heaven and the Glory of GOD fill The Temple, they fell on their knees, bowed their heads, and worshiped, thanking GOD: Yes! God is good! His love never quits!”

This was a dramatic picture of God's accepting and answering prayer. Few prayers

are ever answered so dramatically, but all prayers are answered when offered from a heart full of sincerity and truth. Sometimes the answer is “No.” The request cannot be granted because it would not achieve the greater good, nor would it fulfill the Word of God, the Holy Bible. And the Word of God must always be fulfilled. Remember: if we sow wickedness in life, we will reap wickedness. If we sow good, we will reap good. No matter what we may pray, God cannot violate His Word nor His promises that are spelled out in the Holy Scripture.

March 25th – Keep My Statutes and Ordinances (*2 Chronicles 7:12-22*)

⇒ Golden Text - 2 Chronicles 7:14 (AMP) – “If My people, who are called by My name, shall humble themselves, pray, seek, crave, and require of necessity My face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, forgive their sin, and heal their land.

Just as Solomon was warned by God, so are we warned. God demands obedience, demands that we keep His commandments. If we keep them, we will be blessed. But if we disobey God, ignore and fail to keep His commandments, we will face the hand of His judgment.

Allonah Ashworth is an 8th grade student at Moss Bluff Middle School. In a sea of hundreds of students, her skin color and a unique interest in a sport that is not typical to a student from her culture or background causes her to stand out. As a tall, African American student in a predominantly white school, many assume her interest would be basketball or track, but Allonah always responds, “Swim is my sport.”

As a little girl, Allonah loved the water. She enjoyed watching swim on television and enjoyed every moment she could get in the pool. When Allonah was in the 5th grade, she began training with swim coaches at Dynamic Dimensions to improve her swim skills. Allonah was not the fastest or most coordinated and the only black. She was asked why she had to wear a swim cap, why she was shaped the way she was, and why her hair look the way it did when it was wet. These questions and other comments did not bother Allonah because she has had to face them at school. Many of the kids she trained with have been her peers since kindergarten, so she understood that they were not trying to offend her but understand why she looked different.

Allonah spent a lot of time on her own in the pool practicing lap after lap working to improve her skills. It was when she began training at Swimsational Swim School in Sulphur that her skills became sharp. The instructors worked with Allonah and were intrigued with her skill, dedication and future potential.

Allonah joined the Shockwaves Swim team in 2017 and competed for the first time in the Summer winning the following awards:

- 4 1st Place
 - 3 3rd Place
 - 2 4th Place
 - 5 Best Time
 - 2 Heat winners
 - 2017 Shockwaves Team Personal Best Time
- Her participating strokes were Freestyle, Backstroke, Butterfly.

Allonah experienced an injury during the Breaststroke Heat and received therapy in the fall of 2017 to improve her ability to perform that stroke.

Allonah looks forward to the upcoming 2018 swim season with the ultimate goal of competing to represent the United States of America in the Olympics.
